

Thanks also to Terry Brown who chaired the Adjudicators' meeting, recorded the results, organised trophies and certificates, and guarded them with his life from prying eyes. Thanks to Geoff for manning the bio box, Donna May for serving our drinks, and last but certainly not least, eternal thanks to Yvonne Starr and Sandra Cechner for missing all the fun whilst slaving away in the kitchen preparing the magnificent supper.

On the same weekend as the Awards night, auditions for *Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet* Street, were held. I'm told that there has been some serious talent cast, and I anticipate an exciting season.

Meanwhile – The set for *Midnight Murder...* is under construction, safe in the expert hands of he who must not be named, Alistair Woodcock, assisted by Karen Woodcock. Bookings are open and tickets are selling fast. Make sure you don't miss this one, as it's certain to be another sellout.



MEET THE DUCCTOSS

MIDNIGHT MURDER AT HAMLINGTON HALL IS CURRENTLY IN REHEARSAL ON THE GARRICK STAGE. CARLY RANGER, GARRICK GAZETTE'S EDITOR, SAT DOWN WITH THE DIRECTORS SARAH HOUSE AND KIRSTIE FRANCIS TO TELL US MORE ABOUT THE PLAY, THEIR PROCESS AND THE PRODUCTION.



Carly: Sarah and Kirstie, welcome to the Garrick Gazette. Your play, Midnight Murder at Hamlington Hall is currently in rehearsal, with the opening night on Thursday, 27 March. How has the rehearsal process been so far?

Kirstie and Sarah: Rehearsals have been great so far. We are fortunate to have an experienced cast (and crew) and they have been a pleasure to work with.

Carly: Yes, I have seen your amazing cast list, you have Jim Brown, Jack Riches, Jarrod Buttery, Meredith Hunter, Jay Shaw and Olivia Keary - what a line up! What have been your memorable moments?

Kirstie and Sarah: The play is about actors putting on a play, so we have had fun exploring the idea of doing a play within a play – with a lot of laugh-out-loud moments during rehearsals.

Carly: What inspired you both to choose this particular play for your production?

Kirstie: Sarah's sister went to see a play put on by the Ensemble Theatre in Sydney and she messaged Sarah and said we should consider it. She knows one of the writers (Mark Kilmurray) and said he would love to see other theatres put the show on. We have talked about directing a play together for a while and have been looking at plays for the 2025 season and when Sarah's sister mentioned this play, we agreed that it looked like it would be a fun play to put on. We also love that it's recent, Australian and deals with the difficulties of putting on a show when actors are unable to turn up because they are unwell. Very timely!

Carly: Indeed, I think we can all recall a production we knew, having periods of uncertainty due to sickness. On that note, can you share any challenges you've faced while directing this play?

Kirstie and Sarah: Oh yes! The 'play within the play' presents some acting, blocking, costume and prop challenges. The actors play many roles and keeping up with all the changes is indeed a challenge.

Carly: Given that some of the Garrick audiences have never before set foot on a stage, how do you think they will react to the comedic elements of the 'play within a play'?

Kirstie and Sarah: We hope they will be laughing and enjoying the antics presented on the stage. We think they will marvel at how the actors manage to change from one character to the next, as we have, and nail the comic timing. I also hope they will feel the heart of the play and connect with community theatre performers knowing that the "show must go on".

Carly: What has been the most rewarding part of working on this production?

Sarah: For me, it's been working with such a talented cast and crew. It's also learning the finer aspects of directing particularly blocking. Kirstie has taken on the task of blocking the play (thank goodness!) and it's been great watching the process of that. Also, thoroughly enjoying the rehearsal process. Not only the laughs but the problem-solving.

Kirstie: It has been the challenge of directing a play that has such importance on comic timing to keep it funny but without tipping into the hammy side of theatre. The actors have made it a lot easier as they naturally have comedic timing and the ability to jump into different characters easily.

Carly: How do you both approach the balance between comedy and the mystery elements in the play?

Kirstie and Sarah: The idea of a murder mystery is the key element of the show, so we need to get the mix of comedy and mystery right. The audience will be familiar with the mystery genre and the comedy will come from that.

Carly: Can you tell us about your association with the Garrick Theatre and its significance to you?

Sarah: I've been involved with the Garrick for over 20 years. I was president in 2003/4 and I have been involved in the newsletter, directing one-act plays, stage managing and performing. Kirstie has been involved with productions at Garrick but is the first time directing here.


Carly: I've recently debuted as a director - I'd be interested to know what advice would you give to aspiring directors who want to work in community theatre?

Kirstie and Sarah: Give it a go! You need time (lots of it) and you need a good mentor. Surround yourself with experienced people and don't be afraid to take advice and ask for help. It helps to know what you want and to be able to work with people. A huge part of directing is negotiating and problem solving - probably my favourite part - and it's fun!

Carly: We're almost out of time (and newsletter space), but speaking of spaces, how do you think the unique setting of the Garrick Theatre enhances the experience of this play? We know it can be a bit spooky at times...

Kirstie and Sarah: It's uncanny. This play feels like it was written for this space. It even mentions the hall next door. The actors in the play have to finish the play by a certain time because there's a party due to start and they don't want the music to disrupt the play so having the pub close by to this theatre, there is often band music coming from there which the actors on stage have to overcome so very fitting for this particular production. It's also a community theatre space and this play is about community theatre actors putting on a play because they have the same passion as we all do.

Carly: As we say in the play-world, Chookas to the cast and crew of Midnight Murder at Hamlington Hall! Kirstie and Sarah: Thanks Carly, and thank you Garrick Gazette.


